Certificate III in Home & Community Care (CHC30308)

This is an ideal course for those who like helping others and assisting older people with personal care and activities of daily living. Work as a personal carer offers satisfaction, flexibility and steady employment opportunities.

Job roles include

- Personal care attendant (PCA)
- Nursing assistant
- Community care worker
- Home care worker
- In-home respite giver

This course will suit people who are returning to study and employment as well as those who are currently working in the aged care or HACC industry and need to obtain a qualification.

Students can choose to study these 2 nationally recognised qualifications concurrently or as individual courses.

Selection criteria

An aptitude for working in the Aged Care or HACC fields and good basic communication and literacy skills are required. Applicants must also be physically able to provide personal care and assistance to older people. Preference will be given to students who have experience in interacting with or caring for older people.

Practical placement

Students must have a current satisfactory police records check. Placement hours are undertaken throughout the course in both low and high care facilities.

Access and equity

The principles of access and equity will be applied in the selection of students and in the delivery of training and assessment.

Language, literacy and numeracy support

Support may be available to meet course requirements and participants requiring support are encouraged to enroll in our language and literacy classes.

Assessment

Assessment is consistent with the Australian Quality Training Framework which covers direct delivery. Assessment tasks include workplace assessment, simulated workplace assessment, written assignments, project and classroom activities.

Recognition of prior learning (RPL)

Sandybeach Centre recognises AQF qualifications and statements of attainment issued by other RTOs. Participants may be eligible for RPL if they can demonstrate competence in the required skills and knowledge of the qualification.
